


Greetings from near and far,


Boston, MA

Annual Member Dues




From the Current Delegation

"Amidst the challenges of current times, the 2022 delegation has found some creative ways to remain connected to each other and alumni. We held weekly Monday meetings in a new location that serves other societies as well. Three highlights of the term for us were planning the Homecoming Alumni event, meeting Doug and Steven, and distributing letters with resources to underclass students. These 100 letters were distributed to affinity spaces such as La Casa, LALACS, Shabazz, the NAD House, Chinese Language House, etc., as well as to random '23s and '24s. They contained a barcode that led to an Excel sheet with resources on where to find financial, food, mental, academic, and career resources. 100 were distributed but the barcode was scanned over 188 times!
