

A Letter from Our President

A LETTER FROM DOUG CHIA '93

Greetings to all C&G alumni. I would like to update you on some of the goings on with the C&G Senior Society.

The C&G Inc. Board

First, I must say a few words that are long overdue. In my inaugural letter to C&G alumni, I thanked the last board of C&G Inc., and in particular Ed Kania '79 and Tom Tomai '79, for their loyal, dedicated, and selfless service to the students and alumni of C&G over many years. But what I neglected to do is (1) apologize to the entire C&G Inc. board for the way they were treated in the final months of 2020; and (2) thank them for their sustained and generous financial contributions to C&G.

As you will recall, in 2020 C&G found itself in dire straits due to restrictions imposed by the College and the Town of Hanover to control the spread of COVID-19. In the face of this, Ed, Tom, and the rest of the board spent countless hours wrestling with issues facing the Castle and the 2021 Delegation that the rest of us could not truly appreciate. True to the spirit of C&G, our leaders convened many times within a compressed period to deliberate and make difficult decisions in a situation created by forces beyond their control using their collective best judgment for the short- and long-term survival of C&G.

Sadly, these loyal C&G leaders who had dedicated so much in the past were met with a shocking level of ingratitude, vitriol, and inflammatory accusations from a range of C&G alumni, both publicly and privately. Civil discourse on major issues has been the hallmark of C&G since its inception. In the face of adversity in 2020, this did not hold up. While the C&G Inc. board went to great lengths to publicize the situation that C&G faced and the decisions that had to be made, what was not publicized was the considerable financial support each of those board members gave to ensure the newly created C&G Senior Society started on solid footing when it was established in the final days of 2020. Even though the legacy board was dissolving, its members donated generously for the greater long-term good of C&G.

On behalf of the C&G Senior Society, I would like to apologize to the members of the C&G Inc. board for how they were treated by many members of C&G after decades during which we all reaped the benefits of their service and contributions. As the leader of the new C&G Senior Society board, I wish to express sincere gratitude and respect for the long-time leaders who built C&G and acted as loyal stewards over decades without asking for praise, personifying the ideals of C&G.

The 2023 Delegation

The 2023 Delegation is off to a great start, and it was energizing to see them interact with C&G alumni from a range of delegations who attended our reception before Dartmouth Night at the end of October. Consistent with years past, the current C&G delegation is comprised of a diverse group of seniors who are making important contributions and rendering loyal service to Dartmouth College.

The 2023 Delegation includes members of Palaeopitus and the Student Government; the Vice President of the Senior Class Council; leaders of (Alpha Theta), (Epsilon Kappa Theta), (Sigma Nu), Panarchy, and The Tabard; James O. Freedman Presidential Scholars; Stamps Scholars; Mellon Mays Undergraduate Fellows; Senior Admissions Fellows; Dartmouth Outing Club leaders; and First-Year Trips coordinators. And three members of the 2023 Delegation were recently inducted into the Dartmouth chapter of (Phi Beta Kappa).

Events

As we did last year, we held a Homecoming reception at Tom Dent Cabin ahead of the Dartmouth Night festivities. We are also planning the traditional Spring Feast to take place in Hanover in April. In addition, we are hoping to facilitate gatherings of C&G delegations during class reunions. I am looking forward to seeing many members of my own delegation next June to reconnect and celebrate the 30th anniversary of our graduation from Dartmouth.

The Castle

Many of you have asked me about the current status and future of the Castle. You will recall that the Castle is owned and controlled by The Casque and Gauntlet Trust, which is a separate entity from the C&G Senior Society. The boards of the two entities are completely independent of one another, and neither I nor any of the members of the board of the C&G Senior Society are authorized to represent or speak on behalf of the Trust. We look forward to hearing updates from the Trustees in due course.

Your Contributions

Thank you to the many of you who contributed to our dues and donations campaign this fall. We raised well over the \$10,000 goal we set, receiving contributions from delegations ranging from 1961 to 2022! This gives the organization a solid base from which to support student and alumni activities going forward. In addition to your financial contributions, we encourage you to volunteer to get more involved in the work of the C&G Senior Society. Our board is a dedicated group, but it is small and would appreciate time and assistance from enthusiastic alumni.

Communications, led by our Secretary, Brenna Gourgeot '18. Brenna produces our informative newsletters and timely announcements.

Alumni-Student Engagement, led by Han Vale '20. Han organizes our events, including the Homecoming reception in the Fall term and the Spring Feast in the Spring term.

Treasury, led by our Treasurer, Steve Tseng '95. Steve works with the current delegations to plan their budgets and leads our annual alumni dues and donations campaign.

History, led by our Historian, Ned Ward '89. Ned grows and curates our collection of historical writings and photos, which we hope to house on our website in the near future. The History committee will also help educate new C&G delegations on the rich lore of C&G and legends of the Knights of the Round Table.


2023 COMMENCEMENT & REUNIONS COMMITTEES

REMEMBERING DICK JAEGER

Dick Jaeger believed in Dartmouth's future in every capacity. After graduating in 1957, Jaeger worked in the Dartmouth Admissions office for 25 years. He was then hired as the athletic director and lead Dartmouth to some of its most memorable victories over his 13 years in the position.

Shepherding Darmouth to 46 lvy League Championsips and countless national championships, we also have him to thank for the construction of the Alexis Boss Tennis Center, Scully-Fahey Field and Blackman practice fields, along with a complete renovation of Leverone Field House.

He managed the Castle after his retirement and many C&Gs have fond memories of his help and preservation of 1 Main St. He passed away on September 27th, 2022 and left an indelible legacy which has shaped us all.




REMEMBERING JIM WRIGHT

Known best as Dartmouth's 16th President, Jim Wright left a wake of accomplishments stretching far beyond Hanover.

Coupled with his 40 year service teaching American History at Dartmouth, Wright was also a Guggenhein Fellow, Charles Warren Fellow at Harvard and a member of the American Academy of Arts and Sciences. He held countless board appointments from the Marine Corps to college athletics and college accessibility.

While Wright was not an official member of C&G, he was "knighted" during his presidency by the class of 2008 and his cane was found in his office upon his passing on October 10, 2022.
