C&G Board Election 2024: Two board positions (President and Vice President) are up for new, three-year terms.

- (2) considering serving a term on the board of directors (and self-nominating) for that role;
- (3) or volunteering for this year's Election Committee!

<u>Descriptions of the President and Vice President's</u> roles and responsibilities are included in the Nomination Form (see link below).

Election Committee description (to sign up, see link below): Under our bylaws, C&G board elections are run by a small Election Committee made up of 3-5 members. The composition of this committee must include 1 student, 1 current board member and at least one general body member. The elections committee is only active for a few months and is responsible for taking nominations and communicating with nominees, collecting and sharing candidate bios from the nominees who accept their nomination, sending and tallying ballots.
